



### K-12 STUDENTS SERVED

The % of students in grades 1-5 who reported having difficulty reading dropped from 75% to 60% after one term of Lunch Buddies.



#### EXPANSION

HOSC partnered with District 214's Life program to provide service learning and prevocational activities to students with medical challenges, advancing their independent living skills.

HOSC also scaled <u>Lunch Buddies</u> to train and manage 15 special education students from The Academy, a District 214 specialized school, to lead as reading tutors to 42 English language learners in grades 1-5 at District 59's Rupley Elementary School in Elk Grove Village.

### OLDER ADULTS IN NEED

- 76 volunteers provided 306 rides to medical appointments.
- 53 volunteers helped 1,313 lowincome adults complete their income tax returns at no cost. Refunds totaled \$1,217,672.

### EDUCATION

- 170 volunteers helped 423 adult learners improve their English language skills.
- 40 volunteers donated 1,318 hours to tutor 339 elementary and middle school students.
- More than 800 pen pal letters were exchanged between 28 volunteers and 88 elementary school students.







To bring continuity to national service programs, increase brand recognition, and connect more potential volunteers to opportunities in areas of critical need; the federal government changed the name of the Corporation for National and Community Service to AmeriCorps. Consequently, Senior Corps is now AmeriCorps Seniors.

Although our <u>RSVP program</u> is now an AmeriCorps Seniors program, it continues to connect individuals ages 55 and older with volunteer opportunities at nonprofits in northern Cook and northern DuPage counties the same way it has for the last 29 years.


