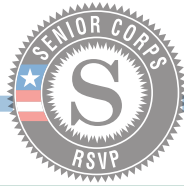

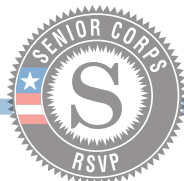

Senior Corps–RSVP service *by the numbers!*

Following is a summary of the outstanding service provided by our members to their communities during our fiscal year, ending March 31, 2018.

162 members

assisted 410 adult learners improve their English language skills to become better informed parents, neighbors, and increase their employment opportunities

10 members

worked with 27 high school students helping them to develop a commitment to giving back to their community

41 members

painted the exterior of 14 financially disadvantaged seniors and disabled individuals enabling them to remain in their homes with pride

67 members

tutored 583 students helping them improve academically

41 members

processed thrift shop donations resulting in additional revenues

11 members

supported food distribution pantries to 2,144 individuals helping to alleviate hunger

57 members

transported 428 older adults to medical appointments

23 members

members in our new Pen Pal program wrote letters to 71 third-fifth grade bi-lingual and ESL students improving their communication skills

26 members

delivered meals to 331 adults providing them with a hot nutritious meal and well-being check

23 members

provided specialized skills to our member organizations helping those organizations do more with fewer dollars

47 members

helped 1,228 filers complete their income tax returns, saving them the cost of tax preparation fees on average of \$250

297 members

volunteered as advisory board members, animal and farm care, reception and administrative support roles, airport guides, art, craft, knit and crochet groups, choir members, current and special events assistance, hospital and nursing home activities, instructors, and homeless shelter workers.

Senior Corps- RSVP Member Insurance

A policy requirement for all Senior Corps-RSVP programs is to provide our members with complimentary insurance protection while driving directly to and from, and while you are participating in, community service as a volunteer. It is highly appropriate that the satisfaction and appreciation you experience as a volunteer be supported by the comfort of knowing you have some help in the event of an accident. The insurance policy is not a substitute for any insurance you now carry. The three kinds of insurance are: Accident Medical Coverage, Volunteer Liability, and Automobile Liability. To accurately know the number of our members that use their own vehicle to commute to

and from their volunteer assignment, you will receive a phone call from our Senior Corps-RSVP office in the month that your current license expires, asking you to verify that you have renewed your driver's license. While we understand peoples' reluctance to provide personal information over the phone, we stress the necessity of being able to have current information. We immediately identify that the call is from the Senior Corps-RSVP Program office and all information remains confidential. We hope that this notice will help to relieve any concerns regarding these phone calls to you. Your cooperation in responding to these phone calls is appreciated.
