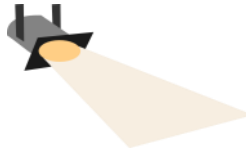


Women’s History Month is celebrated all month in March! At Volunteer Delaware 50+ more than 70% of the volunteers on our roles are women. Why do we need to celebrate women’s history? The reasons abound. Starting in the early days of our country’s founding, women played supporting roles, caring for home and hearth. Were they? When men went off in multiple wars (Mexican-American, Indian Wars, the Civil War, Spanish American War, through the World Wars, and Korea) women took on the many roles which were not mainstream for them. Women obtained skills such as processing food and making uniforms. They learned to drive and started to operate farm machinery. In the later wars, women spies were key to unlocking crucial enemy secrets, and codes. Several factories depended on a predominantly women work force to run to machinery needed for war and for home goods.

These roles came without rights. Conventions, and conferences suffrage movements were forming in the mid to late 1800’s. First came the 14th amendment to the constitution guaranteeing all persons born in the US dual process, citizenship and equal protection in 1870. The 19th amendment, ratified in 1920 offered women the right to vote. It was in 1974, the Equal Opportunities Credit Act (EOCA) that women could obtain their own credit card without a man’s signature. Purchasing a home was also impossible for a woman alone until the 1970’s.

If you are one of the 70% of our women readers, consider your strength and character. You and your ancestors, distant and those you remember, remind us of a journey of gutsy determination. Volunteer Delaware 50+ women do everything from building homes to comforting the sick. Celebrate the past and present during this Women’s History Month!

Portions of Fowler Beach to Close for 2025 Shorebird Nesting and Migration

Portions of the Fowler Beach area of Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge which includes the bay beach, dunes and back-barrier portions will close beginning **March 1st** for the benefit of federally and state protected beach-nesting and migratory shorebirds, including red knot, piping plover, oystercatcher, least tern and other species.

When visiting Prime Hook NWR beaches during beach-nesting bird season, please remember to obey all posted signs and barriers.

- Dog walking is prohibited.
- Closed areas are subject to change and/or modification at any time.
- The beach area will re-open on October 1st for full visitor use.

What is a CASA?

A CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) is a specially trained volunteer appointed by a Family Court Judge to advocate for the best interest of a child experiencing foster care.

What do CASAs do?

- Advocate for children experiencing foster care due to abuse and neglect.
- Establish strong, stable connections with their assigned youth.
- Advocate to ensure the child receives needed essential services.
- Attend meetings and gather information from parties involved in the child's life.
- Work with the Child Attorney and CASA Coordinator to make recommendations in court for what's best for the child.
- Remains involved in the case until the child is reunified with their family or when that is not possible, works to find a safe and permanent home.
- Meet with the child face-to-face at least once a month.
- Attend all court hearings to testify to their findings and recommendations as the child's advocate.

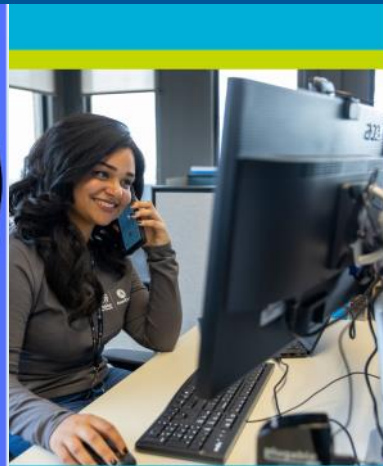



Join the Nanticoke Watershed Alliance as a Nanticoke Creekwatcher in the eighteenth year of our award-winning community science program! We're currently looking for volunteer Creekwatchers to adopt sites. All of our sites are foot-accessible. We currently have sites available in/near:

- Quantico, Hebron/Mardela Springs, and Vienna, MD, and
- Woodland, Bridgeville, Seaford, and Bethel, DE.

During 2025, Creekwatchers will visit their adopted sites every other Sunday or Monday from March 23/24 to November 2/3. Creekwatchers will use provided equipment to take a suite of measurements directly in the water. In addition, Creekwatchers will grab water samples that will be analyzed by our partner labs. Lastly, Creekwatchers will make observations about their sites. Generally, most Creekwatchers take about 20-30 minutes at each site to complete monitoring tasks, along with travel time.

All Creekwatchers must be available to monitor sites at least 14 out of 17 sampling periods during the season. Creekwatchers must also have reliable transportation and be able to deliver samples and datasheets to one of our drop-off sites. Minors are welcome to participate with adult supervision and can earn service learning hours by participating.

Nanticoke Watershed Alliance provides all equipment needed, along with training and on-going support. Data are reported to the Chesapeake Data Explorer, which in turn is accessible to state and federal agencies, residents and visitors, and partners who need high-quality water quality data. The States of DE and MD use Creekwatchers data for Clean Water Act Reports. Lastly, NWA uses data to create an annual Nanticoke River Report Card.

If you are interested and register for this training please be sure to let Beth know that you saw the opportunity in the newsletter and let us know so that we can capture your volunteer hours.

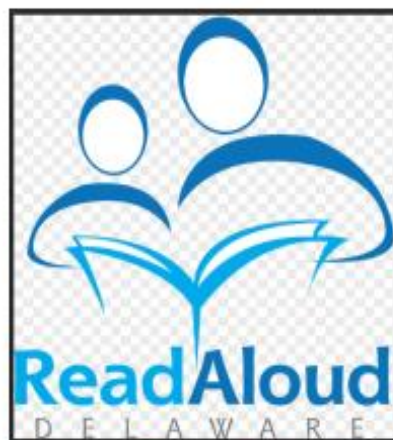
