Become a Coach or Volunteer and Make a Difference



Volunteers who want to work with kids in our Life Skills sessions on the golf course, will have a short interview/conversation with one of our current coaches or staff members. Afterwards, you will receive information on how to proceed with a criminal background check, and our Safe Sports Training. Combined, the background check and Safe Sports Training takes approximately 2 hours. This online training and can be done at your convenience

Once you complete the two steps above, our business manager will set you up with a DOCEBO account. Through DOCEBO, you will complete the Assistant

Coach Training as well as any further training modules needed for higher level coaching. The Assistant Coach Training (ACT) is a 2-hour online training, where you can also stop and start back at the point you left, and you can do it at your convenience as well.

Join the Nanticoke Watershed Alliance as a Nanticoke Creekwatcher in the seventieth year of our award-winning community science program! We're currently looking for volunteer Creekwatchers to adopt sites, especially in Maryland. We also have a limited number of sites available in Delaware. All of our sites are foot-accessible. We currently have sites available in/near:

- Mardela Springs,
- Sharptown,
- Quantico,
- Bridgeville/Seaford,
- and Bethel, DE.

During 2024, Creekwatchers will visit their adopted sites every other Sunday or Monday from March 24/25 to November 3/4. Creekwatchers will use provided equipment to take a suite of measurements directly in the water. In addition, Creekwatchers will grab water samples that will be analyzed by our partner labs. Lastly, Creekwatchers will make observations about their sites. Generally, most Creekwatchers take about 20-30 minutes at each site to complete monitoring tasks.

All Creekwatchers must be available to monitor sites at least 14 out of 17 sampling periods during the season. Creekwatchers must also have reliable transportation and be able to deliver samples and datasheets to one of our drop-off sites. Minors are welcome to participate with adult supervision.



We especially need volunteers to adopt sites in the MD part of the watershed in 2024. We have sites available in/near:





Nanticoke Watershed Alliance provides all equipment needed, along with training and on-going support. Data are reported to the <u>Chesapeake Data Explorer</u>, which in turn is accessible to state and federal agencies, residents and visitors, and partners who need high-quality water quality data. The States of DE and MD use Creekwatchers data for Clean Water Act Reports. Lastly, NWA uses data to create an <u>annual Nanticoke River Report Card</u>.



The Court Appointed Special Advocate Program (CASA) of Delaware is expanding its efforts to advocate for abused and neglected children. The number of children entering foster care continues to increase daily. The CASA Delaware program needs additional volunteers to help advocate for these vulnerable children, and to ensure each child has a CASA volunteer by their side.

Currently, CASA Delaware only represents 62% of the children in foster care. Research shows that children with a CASA volunteer to advocate for them are:

- Less likely to re-enter foster care.
- More likely to find a safe, permanent home, spending less time in foster care.

More likely to perform better in school.



CASA volunteers are trained members of the community who are appointed by a Family Court Judge to be a voice for Delaware's abused and neglected children. CASAs have varied professional, educational, and ethnic backgrounds. They are selected based on their objectivity, competence, and commitment. Each volunteer accepted into the program must complete 30 hours of initial training. Each CASA volunteer is supported by a CASA Program Coordinator and a Child Attorney to advocate for the best interests of children.

The problems of child abuse and neglect belong to all of us.

Be part of the solution. Be a CASA volunteer.

Titling Assets: Avoiding Probate

A free class is being offered to the Public, at the Georgetown Public Library, located at 123 West Pine Street, Georgetown, Delaware.

The class covers avoiding probate, how to make the transition of property occur seamlessly at the time of death, without "opening an estate". The sponsor, Delaware Money School, is delighted to be able to provide free of charge, an experienced and well qualified instructor, Deirdre O'Shea McCartney Esquire to the public. Having written, spoken and taught on the subject many times, she breaks down what appears to be a complex subject, to simple understandable layman's terms. This class focuses only on steps the lay person can take so assets transfer at death, to the intended beneficiaries by operation of law, immediately and automatically. For those who have served as a personal representative or executor of an estate, they know first hand how complex, expensive and time consuming the probate process can be. Everyone should have a will prepared with a competent Attorney. This class teaches how to prepare an estate in such a manner that the entire probate process can be avoided and the will never comes into play. The Money School is the signature program of the nonprofit Delaware Financial Literacy Institute. They offer more than 600 free, no-hassle personal finance classes a year, throughout the state, taught by volunteers from the nonprofit and corporate sectors.




