Learning, Leading, and Serving Together



Volunteer Delaware 50+ team members — Danielle Briggs, Ann Gorrin, Bobbi Jo Tice, and Arundhati Ghosh — recently attended the Points of Light Conference in New Orleans, a global gathering of nonprofit professionals and civic leaders focused on advancing volunteerism and community impact.

The team engaged in hands-on workshops covering volunteer recruitment, recognition, inclusive engagement, and tech tools to support service efforts across Delaware.

Keynote speakers included:

- Neil Bush, Chair of Points of Light, who emphasized global civic engagement;
- Juju Chang, Emmy-winning journalist and co-anchor of Nightline, who spoke on storytelling and inclusion;
- Eboo Patel, founder of Interfaith America, who explored how service can bridge divides;
- Jennifer Sirangelo, President & CEO of Points of Light; and
- Nikki Clifton, President of Social Impact and The UPS Foundation.

Lauren Tyree, a Delaware high school student, founder of non profit organization SERV, and award-winning filmmaker of "Remember Me", led an amazing workshop on transformative power of storytelling in volunteerism.

The conference also featured many other inspiring speakers who shared diverse perspectives on the impact of volunteerism across sectors.

Energized and informed, the Volunteer Delaware 50+ team looks forward to applying new strategies to strengthen service across the state.



Why Does Knowing the Value of Volunteer Time Matter?

Your volunteers are a valuable resource — you already know that without attaching a number to their work. However, understanding their hourly worth can provide additional insights and benefits for many nonprofit organizations, including:

Justifying volunteer programs and outreach: Putting a financial value to your volunteers' contributions can show executives and managers how beneficial your teams are. When you want to lead a new campaign or expand your reach, you can use the value of volunteers to nonprofit organizations to convince internal decision-makers that they are necessary assets that deserve essential and limited resources.

Applying for grants and support: While the value of volunteer hours can aid internal resources and budget allocation, you can also use it to gain external support. Many organizations offer grants to nonprofits, helping support their causes. By highlighting the value of your volunteers and their work, you can show potential sponsors you have powerful teams to carry out your mission and goals.

Showing your volunteers their value: Nonprofits often devise creative ways to show their appreciation toward their volunteers. From thank you notes to parties, caring for your volunteer teams is a great way to boost retention and motivation for volunteers. Explaining their hourly worth can help them better understand their impact on the organization and their value. They can feel better about the skills they bring and the work they do every day.

Highlighting organization earnings: Because your volunteers don't have a salary with your organization, you can use their hourly worth to emphasize the money you earned over the year. Especially if your volunteers are responsible for fundraising or donations, they directly impact your organization's financial success.

Reflecting changing industry patterns: National, global and industry elements can influence volunteer activity and patterns. Knowing your volunteer's hourly worth can reflect changes occurring in the sector. For example, the rate rose in 2020 due to fewer volunteers. When your nonprofit is facing adversity and challenges, a higher value of the volunteer hour can help you better appreciate your available volunteers.

Your volunteers are powerful forces who carry out several essential operations. When you depend on their efforts to operate daily, knowing their hourly value can help your organization fully understand their worth.

The newly redesigned Healthy Pantry Center offers neighbors in need the opportunity to browse and select food items that best suit their household's needs, rather than receiving a cart of food selected by the Food Bank. This neighbor-choice model empowers families to make selections best suited for their households and enhances the overall experience for those seeking food assistance.

The pantry's operation is not possible without **volunteers** who build relationships with neighbors to ensure that they are connected to other community resources as well.



Seniors Farmers' Market**Nutrition Program**

The Seniors Farmers' Market Nutrition Program is offered statewide in Delaware from June thru October each year. The program provides fresh fruits, vegetables, herbs, and honey at no cost to low-income senior citizens at 15 farmers' markets and 14 on-farm markets in Delaware.

Seniors may register for the program at local senior centers. Eligible seniors will receive \$50 on a gift card which can be used at participating farmers' markets to purchase fresh, locally grown fruits, vegetables, herbs, or honey. Recipients may use their benefits through October 31 and may designate another person to shop for them if they are unable to attend a farmers' market.

A NOTE FROM OUR PARTNER

Senior Home Repair Program

One of the homeowners must be at least 62 years old in order to participate in this program. It is a 2-part program. The first is a \$5,000 grant and if additional work needs to be done in the home, homeowners may choose to also use a \$7,500 no interest deferred loan, so the total amount that can be spent on repairs is \$12,500. This program will focus on code and safety issues first and then weatherization and accessibility repairs.



Senior Tree Removal Program:

One homeowner must be at least 62 years old to participate in this grant program. The program is designed to assist qualified seniors remove damaged, dead or dying trees or tree limbs from their property. Grants are awarded on a first come first serve basis if funding is available. Tree trimming services are not provided through this program.



Architectural Accessibility Program:

This is a grant program. The focus is to make homes more accessibility for the individuals that live in them. Work to be performed through this program includes the installation of ramps, grab bars, bathroom modifications, etc. Funds are limited and available on a first come first serve basis.

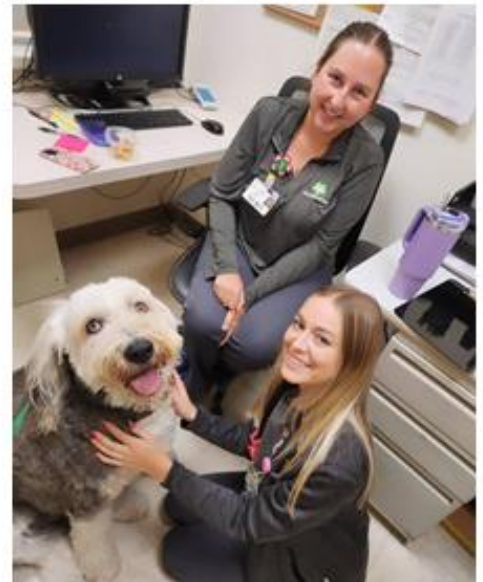

Summer Safety with your pet



Protect your pets from heat stroke

Heat stroke occurs when the body cannot maintain its temperature in a safe range.¹

Heat stroke in dogs can occur in situations such as:

- Being left inside a parked car
- Strenuous exercise in hot weather
- Being muzzled while under a hair dryer
- Being housed on concrete or asphalt
- Being housed without shade or water in hot weather



Normal body temperature of a dog is within 100° to 102.5°F¹



Moderate heat stroke: body temperature from 104° to 106°F¹



Severe heat stroke: body temperature over 106°F¹



A dog can suffer brain damage at 107° and die at 120°²

Animal recovery can occur if body temperature can be lowered

Immediate veterinary care is needed, can be fatal¹



Never leave pets alone inside a parked car

On an 85 degree day, for example, the temperature inside a car with the windows opened slightly can reach 102 degrees within 10 minutes. After 30 minutes, the temperature will reach 120 degrees. Your pet may suffer irreversible organ damage or die.³



Summer travel with your pets

Before you begin your trip make sure to pack:

- Copies of veterinary health and shot records
- Name, phone number and office address of home veterinarian
- List of any medications
- First aid kit
- Extra leash and collar
- Address and phone number of veterinary clinics in areas that you will visit




Antifreeze

As the summer days get warmer, cars that overheat may leak antifreeze. Pets are drawn to the sweetness of this toxic chemical. Even when ingested in very small amounts, antifreeze is poisonous to animals, and a veterinarian should be contacted immediately. Some public fountains may contain antifreeze, do not let your pet drink from them.

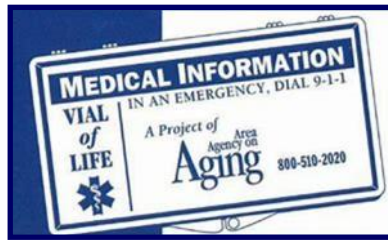

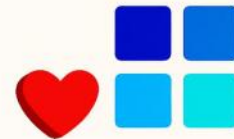
