COVID-19 RESPONSE

Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Jersey Cares has been on the forefront of meeting the most pressing needs of New Jersey communities. Jersey Cares has worked together with hundreds of our nonprofit and community partners to implement new and continuing programs that benefit vulnerable populations:

HEALTHY FOOD DELIVERY PROGRAM – Every family should know where their next meal is coming from. In partnership with the Common Market, Jersey Cares launched the Healthy Food Delivery Program to provide basic groceries to families in need during the pandemic. With the support of our corporate partners, Jersey Cares distributed over 28,000 boxes filled with fruits and vegetables, a quart of yogurt, a loaf of bread, and a dozen eggs to New Jersey communities in need.

DIAPER DRIVE – Parents will do anything to ensure the health and safety of their children. Obtaining basic childcare supplies, like diapers, was extremely challenging at the start of the pandemic. The Jersey Cares Diaper Drive enabled volunteers to collect diapers for families in need using contact-less drop-off. Since 2020, Jersey Cares has collected and distributed more than 62,000 diapers to nonprofit organizations throughout New Jersey.

VIRTUAL WORKSHOPS – Chronic stress, uncertainty, and lack of social interaction are only a few issues faced by students and teachers as distance learning became a new normal. To mitigate these issues, Jersey Cares created a variety of educational workshops for volunteer groups to conduct with New Jersey students virtually. Facilitated with thousands of students throughout the state, these workshops allowed students to gain unique social experiences while learning modern-day skills related to financial literacy, STEM education, and much more.

SENIOR SHOPPERS PROGRAM – Obtaining basic groceries became a weekly challenge for isolated, homebound senior citizens during the height of the pandemic. Through the Senior Shoppers program, hundreds of Jersey Cares volunteers shopped for and delivered over 1,000 custom grocery orders for senior citizens in NJ from April 2020 to December 2021.

AT-HOME KIT ASSEMBLY PROGRAM – Whenever our communities are faced with a major crisis, there are always people willing to help. The At-Home Kit Assembly Program allows volunteers to assemble a variety of kits and packages from the safety of their homes. In response to the emerging needs of our nonprofit partners, these kits provided essential items to individuals in-need individuals such as hygiene products, educational materials, clothing, mental health resources, and more.









2021 PROGRAM IMPACT

Volunteering in 2021 was challenging for individuals and groups alike. Despite obstacles faced by volunteers, like social distancing and working from home, Jersey Cares rose to support New Jersey citizens and nonprofits through our primary programs in addition to our COVID-19 response efforts.




COAT DRIVE


November 9th, 2020 – January 10th, 2021

FIRST NIGHT KIT PROGRAM

January 1st - December 31st, 2021

Jersey Cares volunteers collect hygiene items for domestic violence shelters, transitional housing facilities, runaway safe havens, foster homes and other organizations with transitional populations. These items are given to their clients during the "first night" of their stay. In 2021, Jersey Cares collected & distributed 1,629 First Night Kits.

ANIMAL SHELTER HELPERS

January 1st - December 21st, 2021

Jersey Cares provides essential animal supplies to no-kill rescue shelters for animals during their stay prior to a permanent adoption. In 2021, volunteers collected hundreds of animal supplies distributed to animal shelters throughout NJ.

CARE OF THE PARK

Care of the Park powered by Jersey Cares is a legacy initiative of Branch Brook Park Alliance. As the conservancy for Essex County Branch Brook Park, we protect and preserve a masterwork of landscape architecture principally through volunteer stewardship and workforce development. Core to our mission, we implement programs and partner with organizations that have a positive impact on the social determinants of health for our constituents as they consume the park's resources.

In 2021, Care of the Park engaged over 1,100 community members in health and well-being programs, placing a spotlight on improving the health outcomes for all. Programs includes activities such as yoga, capoeira, and aerobic exercise through boot camp, running, walking groups, and more. Care of the Park also partners with the City of Newark Youth One-Stop Career Center to provide youth workforce development to 20 Newark youth. Park Ambassadors spend four days a week in the landscape learning about horticulture and stewardship and developing critical workforce skills.

JERSEY CARES

YOUTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Jersey Cares Youth Workforce Development (YWD) is a cross-sector collaborative bridge program during out-of-school-time that provides opportunities for low-to-moderate-income youth ages 16- 24 to build economic mobility. The YWD connects underrepresented youth to positive professional relationships, developing critical 21st Century job and life skills.

In tandem with Jersey Cares program staff who provide coaching, our nonprofit partners provide the program's participants with necessary field experience.

AS A RESULT OF THIS PROGRAM IN 2020-2021:

Youth ages 16-24 learned skills related to entrepreneurship, financial literacy, public speaking, leadership, and more.

80% of fellows reported that they are thinking about their future, completed a job application, and connected with employers and employment opportunities.

COMMUNITY LEADERS

As our world continues to change, the needs of our communities change with it. To better understand the needs of our communities and create collaborative relationships across sectors, Jersey Cares has created two new initiatives in 2021:

NONPROFIT ADVISORY COUNCIL

The mission of the Jersey Cares Nonprofit Advisory Council is to create a network of community leaders who will share, collaborate, and advise Jersey Cares in the systemic development of its programs for the support of participants and communities. Meetings are held virtually on a quarterly basis to discuss key issues in communities throughout New Jersey and how we can collectively address them. Each meeting addresses topics related to volunteerism, collaboration across nonprofits, relationship building in the community, and partnership expansion.

ASSOCIATE BOARD

The Jersey Cares Associate Board is a group of emerging leaders who dedicate their own time, talents, networks, and resources to support the work and mission of the organization. During monthly meetings, associate board members collaborate with Jersey Cares staff to help improve programming, develop volunteer recruitment strategies, and create fundraising opportunities.


