

In the spring, Volunteer Services sent out our annual Volunteer Satisfaction Survey to learn about your experience volunteering with The Trustees. Thank you to those of you who participated! We appreciate you taking the time to share your honest feedback and are pleased to share the results from the survey, and our next steps with you!

Overall, 165 volunteers responded to the survey! The questions on the survey covered your satisfaction volunteering at the Trustees, demographic information about volunteers and asked for feedback on ways we can improve.

Here is a summary of the findings from the survey:

- 94% of volunteers are very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their staff supervisor.
- 84% of volunteers are very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the onboarding process.
- 93% of volunteers are very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their overall experience volunteering at The Trustees.

We are really grateful for all of your thoughtful comments, ideas, and perspectives and will be using this constructive feedback to improve the volunteer experience. The feedback provided largely fell into three categories: 1) volunteer website; 2) identifiers for volunteers and 3) staff transition and communications from leadership.

Thanks to this feedback, we will be working on making improvements to Volunteer Connect and hosting a training session about using the website. To help visitors recognize volunteers, ID badges and Trustees lanyards are available to volunteers. We love to hear from you, and appreciate and value your feedback and support. Seeing the commitment and teamwork of our volunteer community inspires optimism about the future of The Trustees.



Property Spotlight: Long Hill

Are you looking for a beautiful and peaceful place to spend an afternoon?

Long Hill in Beverly, is the perfect spot! This beautiful 114-acre estate has such a rich history and is one of the Trustees of Reservations' hidden gems. It was once the summer home of Ellery Sedgwick, a famous magazine editor, and his wife, Mabel Cabot Sedgwick, who loved plants and gardening.



This Federal-style house was built in 1921 and is surrounded by beautiful gardens and woodlands. The mansion is an architectural treasure and assumes an air of timeless elegance. As you tour the rooms, filled with antique furnishings, exquisite artwork, and treasured family heirlooms, you will surely be transported back to a bygone era.

The gardens of Long Hill are a primary attraction and were designed by Mrs. Sedgwick with flowers and trees from around the world. As you wander through the various sections of the gardens you can enjoy vibrant blooms and wildflowers that change with the seasons. Spring is especially beautiful with the blooming colors of the azaleas and rhododendrons.



Stroll along the walkways and you'll pass interesting sculptures and little nooks where you can sit and listen to the birds chirping. On the outskirts of the gardens, there are two-miles of well marked hiking



trails, including a 1.5 mile loop trail. Guided nature walks through the woodlands and gardens provide opportunities to learn about the local wildlife, native plants, and ecological conservation efforts.

Besides being a peaceful place to enjoy the day, Long Hill hosts fun events and educational programs throughout the year. Some of their signature events include an annual plant sale, outdoor concerts, Afternoon Tea and Halloween on the Hill where hundreds of carved pumpkins are lit up and on display. There are also programs to teach people about sustainable gardening practices, plant care, and landscape design.

Long Hill House and Garden is a must-visit attraction for nature enthusiasts and those looking for a quiet and peaceful sanctuary.

Long Hill is open for the season from April 1 – October 30. However, visitor services including the main house will be closed Monday through Friday while the grounds remain open.

New artwork at deCordova Sculpture Park and Museum

Last week, deCordova installed a new sculpture, "A Snail's Pace" by Kathy Ruttenberg. Kathy Ruttenberg creates whimsical ceramic sculptures that conjoin human (primarily female), animal, and plantbased characters. Her works point to poignant qualities of the human condition while urging a sympathetic connection to the natural world. A Snail's Pace depicts a life-sized female figure crouched within a translucent snail shell. Ruttenberg notes, "The sculpture captures the moment of withdrawal when the cell phone is put down and the computer is unplugged...Perhaps it is better to be in the "bubble," moving like a snail, protected from life's hectic pace."

Willow Plant Maintenance - Appleton Farms

Appleton Farms is looking for a volunteer to help care for Willow plantings located in four spots across the property.

Caring for these plantings involves weedwacking surrounding vegetation to reduce competition, maintaining electric fences and tree tubes, looking for signs of predation by deer or rodents and removing invasive species.

Volunteers can create their own schedule.

Time commitment: Varies depending on the month but generally 3-4 hours a week during the summer will be required. Volunteer work will pause during the winter and pick back up in the spring.
