In March 2021, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) tapped VOLUNTEER Hampton Roads to recruit and manage volunteers for their COVID-19 vaccination clinic in Hampton Roads. Within 24 hours we began recruiting volunteers and continued to do so for 56 straight days. Between March and May, volunteers joined hands daily with FEMA, the Department of Defense, Virginia Department of Health, Medical Reserve Corps, Team Rubicon, Virginia Department of Emergency Management and City of Norfolk to provide vaccines to Hampton Roads residents. Volunteers directed patient traffic, screened patients, provided translation services, assisted patients who needed wheelchair support, and conducted observation post-vaccine for over 83,000 patients. It was our privilege to work alongside local volunteers whose dedication and commitment embodies the heart of the 757.

Our donors responded quickly and generously to support VOLUNTEER Hampton Roads’ role to stem the tide of the pandemic in our region. 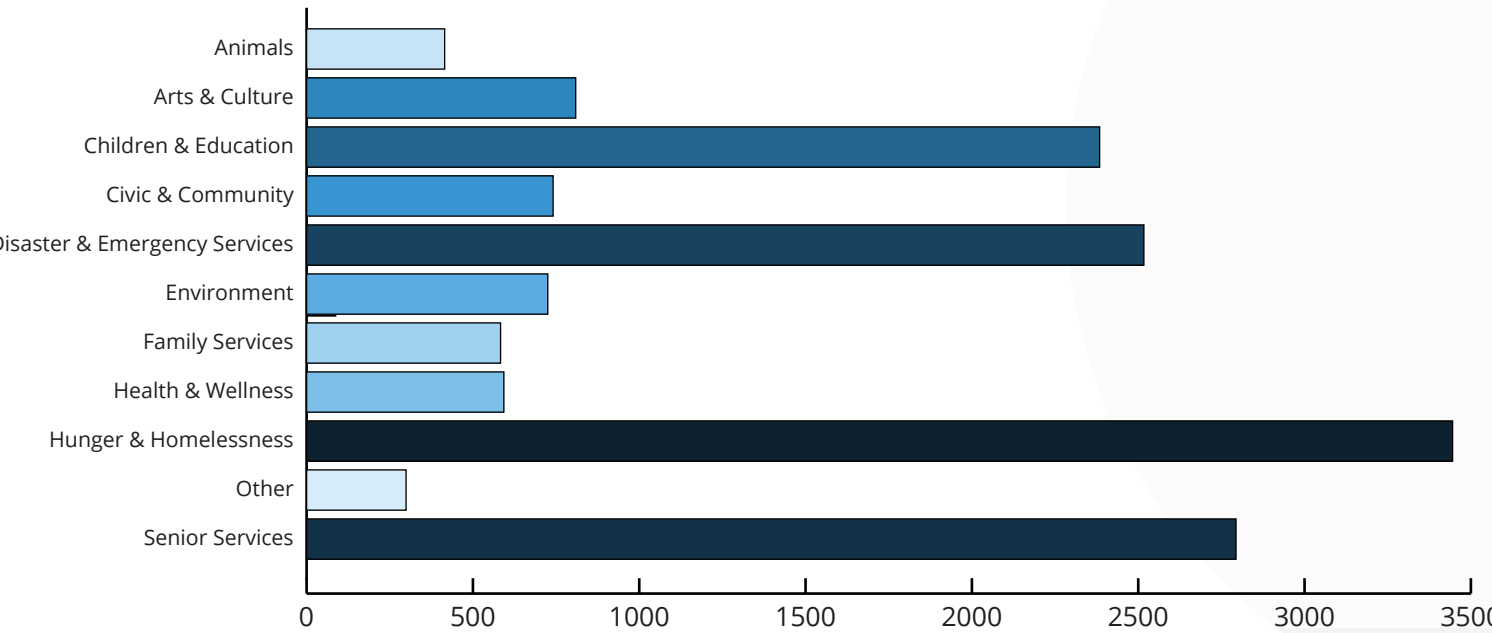

James Spore

President & CEO, Reinvent Hampton Roads

Jim Spore is the President & CEO of ReInvent Hampton Roads following 24 years of service as City Manager for the City of Virginia Beach. Under his leadership, the City of Virginia Beach won accolades as a Best Place to Live in America, as well as one of the top five Best Managed Cities in the Nation and the U.S. Senate Medallion of Excellence for Productivity and Quality.

Spore continues to inspire regional cooperation as he leads ReInvent Hampton Roads, an outgrowth of a community leadership initiative of the Hampton Roads Community Foundation. ReInvent Hampton Roads serves as a community frame for game-changing activity that will improve the economic performance of the region and the Commonwealth.

Spore believes volunteerism elevates all in a caring community. His leadership in area nonprofits demonstrates his commitment to this belief. Spore participates on numerous boards including the Tidewater Community College Real Estate Foundation, CIVIC Leadership Institute, United Way of South Hampton Roads, the Hampton Roads Chamber, the Alliance, Zeiders American Dream Theater, Hospice House of Hampton Roads, RVA757 Connects, and Maritime Industrial Base Ecosystem Strategy Board. Other service includes HRT Long Range Planning Task Force, the transition team for the TCC President, the ODU President's Planning Task Force, research on the Mega-Region, and advising Healthier 757 with EdLogics and the Global Action platform.

Councilmember, City of Virginia Beach

Aaron Rouse was born in Norfolk and raised in Virginia Beach. After graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology, Rouse was drafted by the Green Bay Packers and also played for the New York Giants and Arizona Cardinals.

Once retired from the National Football League, Rouse returned to Virginia Beach to begin his career in public service. He served as a coach and a mentor, eventually founding Rouse's House, a nonprofit organization that serves to establish education as the foundation for youth, exposing youth and families to a broader world of learning.

In 2018, Rouse made history as the youngest African American to be elected to Virginia Beach City Council. In 2019, Rouse was named the only city liaison for Something In The Water Music Festival created by Pharrell Williams, and in 2020, Rouse joined the esteemed CIVIC Leadership Institute Class of 2021.

Rouse's mission is to provide, protect, and produce greatness for the people of Virginia Beach. He furthers this mission through Rouse's House and volunteer service to a range of organizations including Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters, Hampton Roads Youth Foundation, Norfolk Botanical Gardens, Norfolk Sports Club, Read Across America, local civic leagues, Virginia Beach SPCA, Priority Toyota Charities, and Communities In Schools of Hampton Roads.

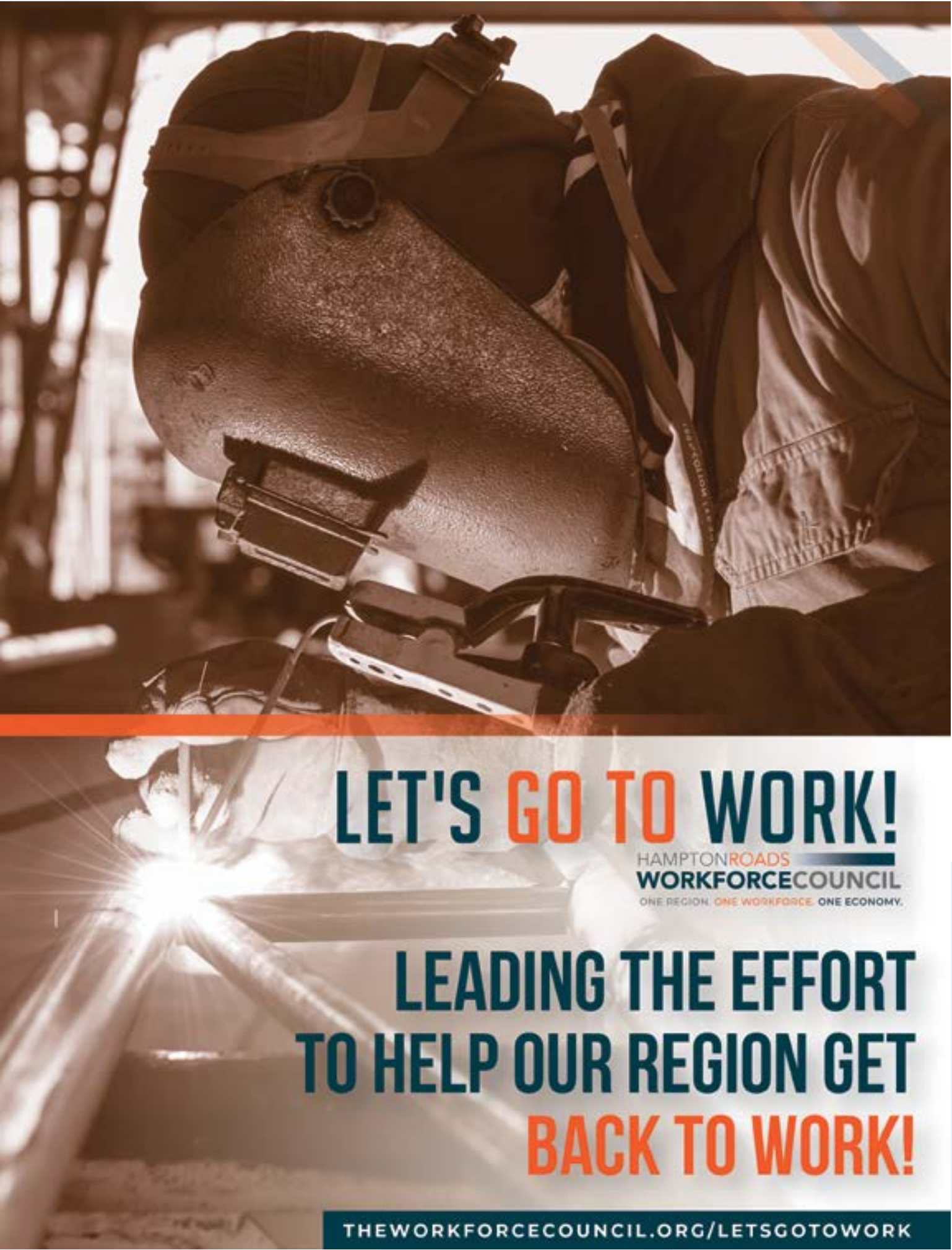

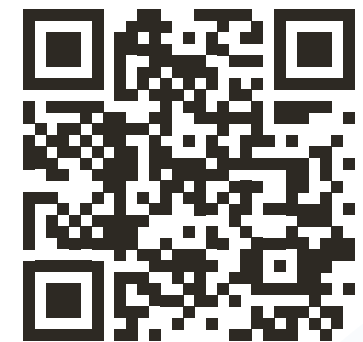
