Here are some of the international aid organizations currently helping on the ground.

The World Food Programme of the United Nations (WFP) is the world's largest humanitarian organization. It operates in more than 120 countries, and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2020. <https://www.wfp.org>

The OCHA, the **United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs**, coordinates all the UN's emergency assistance. <https://www.unocha.org>

International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement This organization is the world's biggest humanitarian network.
